# **HIV Perceptions Survey**

Today, HIV is a treatable, long-term condition and with the right treatment and care, people living with HIV can lead full and healthy lives. But stigma and misconceptions remain significant factors in people's experience of living with HIV, and inhibits testing and prevention interventions.

The purpose of this survey was to discover the general public's current knowledge, perceptions and beliefs about the realities of HIV.

# **HIV stigma still persists**

"I think there is still a misunderstanding about HIV and also possibly stigma attached to it, I don't know anyone with HIV - unless they're not telling me!"

"I remember when HIV was considered a death sentence and am pleased with the medical advances but unfortunately there is still a stigma and ignorance by many"

"If I had HIV I would tell my family but probably not anyone else as there is still a great deal of prejudice around [HIV]"

"GPs should make enquiries about how aware their patients are during visits and offer tests. This will help some people notice things they might not be aware of earlier"

# What did the survey find?



Almost 1 in 5 (18%) still believe that HIV can be passed on from person to person by kissing



1 in 4 (25%) people surveyed either did not know, or were unsure of the difference between HIV and AIDS



When asked if having an **HIV test is a good idea**, reassuringly 4 in 5 (78%) people agreed



However, 2 in 5 (42%) people didn't know where they could get tested



But, 7 in 10 (70%) people surveyed said they would feel comfortable being offered an HIV test by their GP

### **About the HIV Perceptions Survey**

The HIV Perceptions survey commissioned by ViiV Healthcare was designed to assess how people perceive HIV today. 900 members of the general public in Greater Manchester were surveyed.
